Shalom from Israel! Zhava and I have been in the Holy Land for the last six weeks, encouraging our staff and meeting Israelis, both believers and non-believers. We want to be as much help as possible to the great team we have in Israel. I feel as if I have one ear to the ground and one ear towards heaven asking the Lord to help me and our Israel staff to determine the best strategy for sharing the Good News among Israelis.

I would like to tell you some of what our staff and volunteers have done in

Israel this summer, but I also want you to know about some very exciting developments in New York City. We focus our summer short-term mission teams on Israel and New York because these two places contain more than 75% of the world's Jewish population!

So this month, in place of our usual issue of *The Chosen People* newsletter, I want to fill you in on some of our summer evangelistic activities. After all, you have made so much of this ministry among the Jewish people possible through your prayers and support!

Summer Evangelists in STEP

our short-term missions for many years. We find that the right combination of training, evangelistic opportunities and exposure to New York City's rich heritage of Jewish history and culture proves to be a very memorable investment of time and resources.

This year, one of our special outreach events was a lecture on the spiritual roots of antisemitism—the first special event to be held at our new Brooklyn Messianic Center, which is in the heart of a very Jewish neighborhood!

Jennifer Rodgers, one of our gifted young leaders, wrote a stirring report about the event:

Our STEP team was on the streets near the new Center passing out fliers and inviting people to come to a lecture on the spiritual roots of antisemitism. The

Many of the Russian Jewish believers happily interacted with the young ladies, sharing the Gospel and loving these ones who desired to pull people away from the Gospel message. team encountered both interest and opposition by the locals, they learned that there was now a nearby Center proclaiming Yeshua (Jesus) as the Messiah.

As the lecture began, Russian Jewish believers and seekers gathered to hear Greg Zhelezny share about antisemitism

throughout history and tell about the Messiah of Israel and His redeeming work. As the evening progressed, a group of Orthodox Jewish people gathered outside of the Center, protesting the message of Jesus and arguing over the validity of presenting Him as Messiah.

Near the end of the lecture, six young Orthodox Jewish women came into the Messianic Center and stood in the back of the room. As Greg finished his message, he opened up the floor for questions. Immediately, the group of Orthodox women moved to the front of the room. One of the young ladies turned to address the crowd and began to argue that Jesus could not be the Messiah, and that we should not be teaching these things to Jews. Greg asked the girls if he might speak with them after the event, and our music team closed the evening.

After the lecture was finished, the Orthodox women remained in the building attempting to convince the attendees that they should not believe in Jesus, or listen to those teaching about Him. Our missionaries, including Mitch Glaser and many of the Russian Jewish believers, interacted with the young ladies, sharing the Gospel and loving these ones who desired to pull people away from the Gospel message.

So began the ministry of the Brooklyn Messianic Center!

We also had a successful event on the Upper West Side of Manhattan, reaching a very different type of Jewish population. We handed out tracts, took surveys, set up a café in our New York Center, and invited non-believers to visit and talk. I wish you could have been there!

As she does every summer, Rachel leads teams of young evangelists who are part of Outreach Israel, our summer program for young people in the Holy Land. Rachel shared some reports with me from the young people who were part of Outreach Israel:

One day at the Holocaust Memorial, I spoke to an army officer who was so impressed that I had come to Israel. I have had doors open easily for evangelistic opportunities because people have sincerely asked me to share in their lives. Another day, I was walking down the street asking directions and one young man offered to guide me. As we conversed, and I told him I was a Jewish Studies major, he was really curious about my faith. He was amazed that I, a believer in Jesus the Messiah, really cared about the Jewish people.
